CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

A. Pattern #17390 – BE11 (snowman toss):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

B. Pattern #17390 – GRY1 (snowman toss):

1. Cut two 2⅞" strips x width of fabric.
2. Cut four 4½" squares.

C. Pattern #17390 – RED1 (snowman toss):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

D. Pattern #17391-GRY1 (border stripe):

1. Fussy cut four 6" x 40½" strips for border (refer to photo).

E. Pattern #17392 – RED1 (flower print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

F. Pattern #17392 – BRO1 (flower print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares, two 5" squares, and one 2½" x 9" strip.

G. Pattern #17392 – GRY1 (flower print):

1. Cut two 5" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

H. Pattern #17392 – BE11 (flower print):

1. Cut four 5" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

I. Pattern #17392 – GRE1 (flower print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.



J. Pattern #17393 – BE11 (geometric print):

1. Cut four 2⅞" strips x width of fabric.
2. Cut four 5" squares.

K. Pattern #17393 – GRE1 (geometric print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

L. Pattern #17393 – RED1 (geometric print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

M. Pattern #17393 – BRO1 (geometric print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

N. Pattern #17394 – GRY1 (holly print):

1. Cut four 5" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

O. Pattern #17394 – RUS1 (holly print):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

P. Pattern #17394 – LTBE11 (holly print):

1. Cut six 5" squares.

Q. Pattern #17395 – MUL1 (plaid):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

R. Pattern #17395 – BRO1 (plaid):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

S. Pattern #17395 – BE11 (plaid):

1. Cut four 2⅞" strips x width of fabric.
2. Cut four 1½" strips x width of fabric for border.
3. Cut four 5" squares.

T. Pattern #17395 – BLA1 (plaid):

1. Cut a 27" square. Cut as many 2½" bias strips from the square, as needed, to measure 252" for binding.
2. Cut four 4½" squares.
3. Cut one 2½" x 9" strip.

U. Pattern #17396 – RED1 (texture):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

V. Pattern #17396 – BE11 (texture):

1. Cut two 2⅞" strips x width of fabric.
2. Cut two 5¼" strips x width of fabric. Cut these into twelve 5¼" squares. Cut these twice diagonally.
3. Cut two 5" squares.

W. Pattern #17396 – DKBRO1 (texture):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.
2. Cut six 2" strips for outer border.

X. Pattern #17396 – GRE1 (texture):

1. Cut four 4½" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

Y. Pattern #17397 – BE11 (holly stripe):

1. Cut four 5" squares and one 2½" x 9" strip.

Z. Pattern #17397 – TAN1 (holly stripe):

1. Cut four 4½" squares, two 5" squares, and one 2½" x 9" strip.



MAKING THE HALF-SQUARE UNITS:

- A. Draw a line along the diagonal of each set (Figure 1).
- B. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line.
- C. Press the seam toward the darker fabric and square each one up to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

MAKING THE SNOWBALL BLOCK UNITS:

- A. Place a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on one corner of a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square (Figure 2).
- B. Stitch along the drawn diagonal line.
- C. Cut off the excess $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the stitching line and press the seam toward the added triangle.
- D. Repeat this on the opposite side of the square. Square each one up to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".

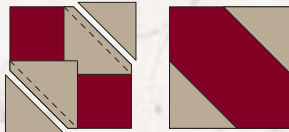

TIPS AND TRICKS:

The Snowball blocks are made with connector corners on four squares. To make marking the diagonal stitching line of the connector corners squares go faster, I used this trick. Instead of cutting eight individual $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of each fabric and then marking the diagonal, I cut two 5" squares. With a 7mm mechanical pencil, I drew lines for both diagonals on the back of the square, then cut the 5" square into the four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

MAKING THE SNOWFLAKE BLOCKS:

1. Layer two 17393 – BE11 geometric $2\frac{7}{8}$ " strips with two 17395 – BE11 plaid $2\frac{7}{8}$ " strips, right sides together. Cut these into twenty-four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Make forty-eight half-square units as described in *Making the Half-Square Units*.
2. Layer the two 17390 – GRY1 snowman toss $2\frac{7}{8}$ " strips with the two 17396 – BE11 texture $2\frac{7}{8}$ " strips, right sides together. Cut these into twenty-four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Make forty-eight half-square units as described in *Making the Half-Square Units*.
3. From the remaining two 17393 – BE11 geometric $2\frac{7}{8}$ " strips, cut twenty-four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut these diagonally to yield forty-eight triangles. Repeat this with the remaining two 17395 – BE11 plaid $2\frac{7}{8}$ " strips.
4. Using the 17393 – BE11 geometric and 17395 – BE11 plaid triangles with the 17396 – BE11 texture triangles, make forty-eight flying geese units as shown in Figure 3. Pay close attention to the placement of the geometric and plaid

triangles in each unit, making each flying geese unit identical.

5. Piece together twelve blocks as shown in Figure 4. Square each of these up to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ".

MAKING THE SNOWBALL BLOCKS:

1. Mark and cut the 5" squares as described in *Tips and Tricks*. You should have a total of one hundred thirty-six $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to be used as connector corners in the Snowball Block units.
2. For each Snowball Block, choose four matching $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and eight matching $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to make four units as described in *Making the Snowball Block Units*.
3. Piece together seventeen blocks as shown in Figure 5. Square each of these up to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ".

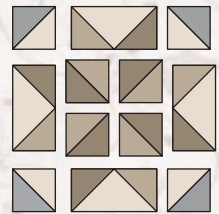

Make twelve identical blocks finishing 8" each.

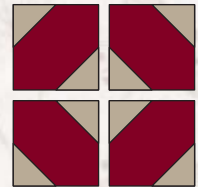

Make seventeen blocks finishing 8" each.

MAKING THE BORDERS:

1. Using the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9" strips, stitch together two sets of ten strips each as shown in Figure 6.
2. Cut each of these sets into four 2" wide strips. Note that we've had you cut these a little long (9" instead of the exact 8" needed) to give you enough excess to re-square as needed.
3. Stitch a strip from each set together to make four border pieces 2 " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ ".
4. From the 17395 – BE11 plaid 2" strips, cut four pieces $40\frac{1}{2}$ " long. Stitch a plaid strip to each pieced border unit.
5. Add a 17391 – GRY1 border stripe to the opposite side of each pieced border unit.
6. Piece together the 17396 – DKBRO1 texture strips to make one long strip. From this, cut two strips $56\frac{1}{2}$ " long for the sides and 2 strips $59\frac{1}{2}$ " long for the top and bottom.

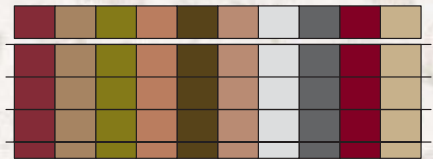
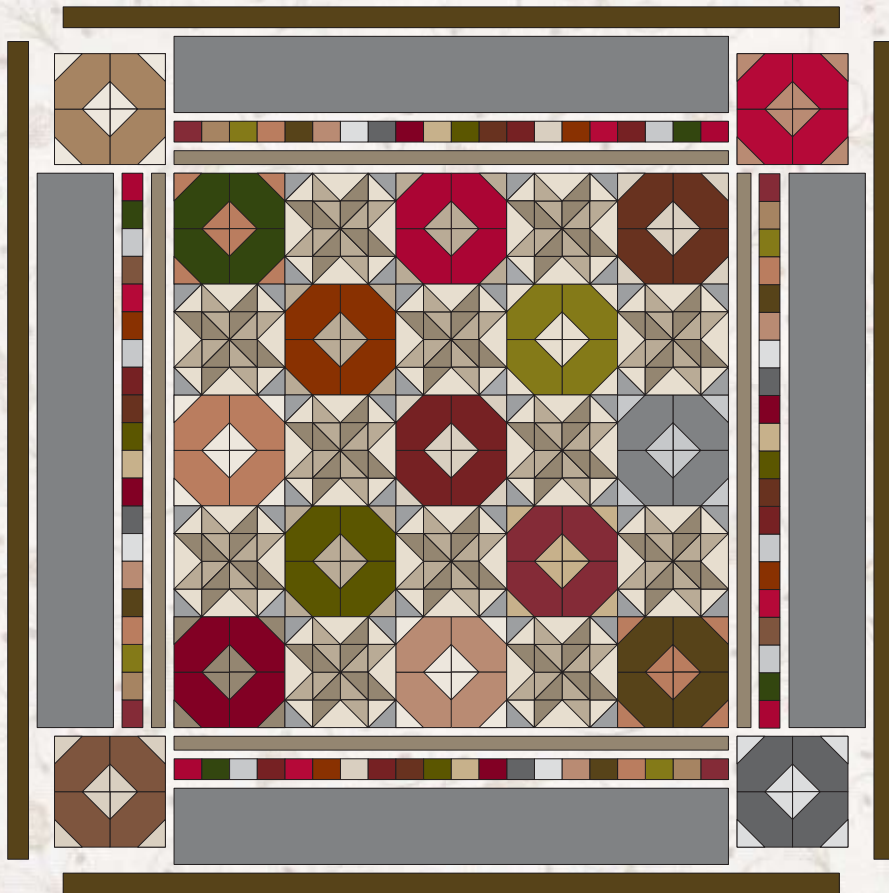

FINISHING:

1. Following the Quilt Diagram (on the next page), stitch together the Snowflake Blocks and the Snowball Blocks.
2. Add a border unit to each side. Add the remaining Snowball Blocks to each end of the remaining two border units and then stitch them to the top and bottom of the quilt.

3. Add the dark brown outer border.
4. Piece together a backing using 17390 – BEII snowman toss. Layer with batting and the backing. Quilt as desired.
5. Sew binding strips together and attach to the quilt using your favorite method.
